Message from the Superintendent

I hope to see all of you at some point during the events and activities planned during this month. Please look over the "Just a Reminder" section of this newsletter that outlines the many opportunities for parents and community members to connect with our school district during the month of May.

Please mark your calendars with a reminder that there will be an early dismissal for students on May 5th at 12:15 p.m. to provide teachers the opportunity to prepare their rooms for Open House and return that evening from 6 to 8 p.m. to meet and greet parents. Students are welcome and

encouraged to be with their parents during Open House as they look over displays and attend special presentations. For more information about activities planned for the evening, please check out the flyer attached to this newsletter. Come help us celebrate the hard work and effort of both the students and teachers!

On May 10, 2010 there will be a Budget Hearing in the cafeteria at 7:30 p.m. At that time I will give a special presentation concerning the proposed school budget for 2010-2011 and be available to answer questions. A special newsletter containing information about the three-part proposed budget, anticipated revenues, and propositions for the purchase of a bus and the election of a candidate for the Board of Education vacancy will be mailed to all residents of the district the first week of May. The budget vote is scheduled for Tuesday, May 18th from 1:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the auditorium.

The Capital Project is humming along. Ground has been broken for the Reading Room connection that will join the Elementary and MS/HS Library. Summer work will include: completing the new playground and Elementary Parent Drop-Off, renovations to the Main Office, relocating the 7th-12th grade Art Room to the High School, renovations to the locker rooms, modifications to playfields, and renovations to the bus garage. Representatives from SEI Design group will be on hand the night of Open House, May 5th in the cafeteria to answer questions. There will be a display of design plans to view as well.

A few people have asked about the trees that are marked near the playground area so I imagine there are others who are wondering as well. Village and district representatives have inspected these trees and determined that they need to be cut down. The trees are rotted in areas. Some have been cabled with wires for some time in an effort to prevent them from falling during high winds or a storm. I too had mixed feelings about the removal of these trees. It's always sad to see a tree cut down but it really is a safety issue and these trees would have needed to be removed eventually regardless of the project. New trees will be planted to replace them. Please keep in mind that we will have an absolutely beautiful playground/park area for the community next to the new trees after the Capital Project is complete.

I am pleased to announce that the Health and Wellness Committee recently was awarded \$4,000 to be used toward health initiatives at Heuvelton Central School. Part of the

funds from this mini-grant will be designated towards a breakfast cart for the High School students. The breakfast cart will provide healthy breakfast and a la carte foods and beverages that High School students will be able to purchase prior to their first period class. The Breakfast cart will be in the High School hallway near the elevator and students can purchase items after the first bell rings at 7:52 a.m.

High School students who wish to purchase their breakfast in the cafeteria may still do so. They will need to remain in the cafeteria area to eat as they have been asked to do in the past. I hope that the High School students who have found purchasing breakfast in the morning challenging time-wise make good use of the opportunity to purchase a healthy breakfast in the High School hallway since research supports that eating a healthy breakfast at the start of the day helps students do better in school.

This grant will also support the purchase of equipment that teachers can use to motivate students to be active during recess. Kudos to Health and Wellness Committee members Mr. Adams, Cafeteria Manager and Mrs. Carmany, Parent Representative for developing the grant!

May is a busy time of the year but it is one of my favorite months because of the increased opportunities to visit with parents and community members during the events that happen this time of year. I look forward to seeing and talking with you in May!

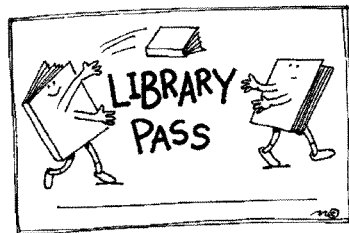

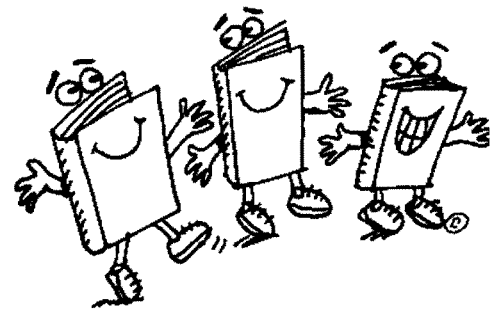

 **LITERACY**

This month we will finish up our stories from the K-Street series with: We Need Construction Workers, Muncha! Muncha! Muncha! and Homes A-Z. For the remainder of May our stories will focus on the springtime season and plants.

As each letter of the alphabet has been formally taught and practiced, we plan to continue working with letters, the sounds they make, and initial sounds in words. We also plan to focus more directly on writing the letters (not just the ones in our names) and their order in the alphabet.

We are continually reviewing rhyming, syllables, and other formally taught skills. This provides extra opportunities for students who haven't fully developed the skill or concept and gives extra practice to those who have.

 **MATH**

Practice, practice, practice. During the month of May the students will continue to work with the skills they have learned since September. (More/Less/Same, patterns, numeral recognition, 1:1 correspondence, etc.) We will also begin teaching simple addition.

 **SCIENCE**

In the spirit of our beautiful (and long awaited) springtime season, we will be learning about plants and how they grow. The students will have the opportunity to conduct an official experiment where they will discover exactly what plants need to grow (air, sunlight, and water). They will also be learning about the

different stages that occur during growth from seed to plant.

NOTE

We will be sending snow pants, extra hats, and mittens home. As the days continue to get warmer and warmer, we ask that you send in a set of spring clothes for your child's spare set. This way if there is an accident they will have a weather appropriate change of clothes.



OPEN HOUSE

On Wednesday, May, 5th the school will be hosting an open house from 6:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. Open House gives parents the opportunity to visit the classroom to see what their child does at school, all day. The kids really enjoy this, because they get to show their parents around the classroom and talk about the things they learn here. Also, because there will not be a formal Kindergarten screening this year, it will be a great opportunity for you to stop in and visit one of the Kindergarten rooms and meet next years teachers.

Overcoming the Stigma of Mental Illness

Greetings from the School Psychologist & Counselor



As May is national mental health month, we would like to once again recognize the valuable services that Linda Myers, the mental health counselor from the Safe Schools/Healthy Students grant, has provided to our students this year. The Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative is funded by a federal grant through St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES. One component of the grant provides school based mental health services which are coordinated through St. Lawrence County Mental Health.

May mental health month is promoted through **The Caring for Every Child's Mental Health Campaign** which is a part of the Comprehensive Community Mental Health Services Program for Children and their Families from the federal Center for Mental Health Services. Parents and caregivers who wish to learn more about mental well-being in children can visit the web site mentalhealth.samhsa.gov/child or call (toll free) 1-800-789-2647 to request or download a free publications catalog.

Increasingly, schools have been working with outside agencies to coordinate mental health services for children in St Lawrence County. While information through community based organizations and the media has helped to dispel the misconceptions and biases regarding mental illness, the stigma related to receiving mental health services still exists in our county and throughout the nation. Unlike a physical illness, mental illness has been seen as a personality weakness. However, mental illness like physical illness has a biological basis. One in five children are affected by mental health difficulties.

Often there is a stigma associated with having to receive mental health services which can cause serious consequences for children. These include feelings of anger, embarrassment and shame, secrecy, social withdrawal and rejection, low self esteem and feelings of hopelessness. Children can also experience academic difficulties. Feelings such as these can increase the



possibility of suicide and self destructive behaviors. Therefore, the response by the adults involved in supporting the child or adolescent through the treatment process is very important. Parents and supporting adults can help children learn to accept their condition by:

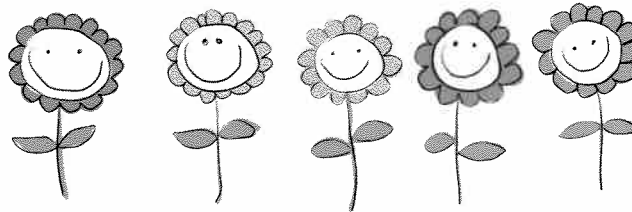
- Reinforcing to the child that treatment is a positive step
- Clarifying that mental illness is beyond the control of the child
- Keeping the child connected with his/her peers
- Communicating with school personnel who are working with the child
- Avoiding labeling the child as "depressed" and restating the condition as the child having depression



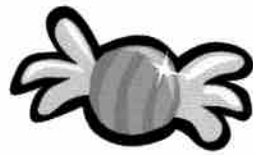
Parents and guardians can also educate themselves regarding the school's obligation to provide accommodations and supports for children with mental illness. In addition, it's important for caregivers to be sure they are receiving additional support which can be done by joining parent advocacy and support groups.

There are many resources available to parents who have a child with an emotional or behavioral problem. These include individual and group counseling, mentoring programs, support groups, parenting classes or respite care.

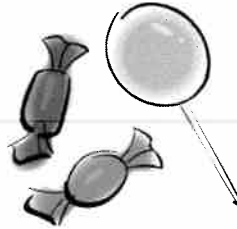
