*Career Education programs (Two-year Programs)*

**AUTOMOTIVE & AUTOMOTIVE ASSISTANT TECHNOLOGIES** - Testing; tune-ups; engine repair; automatic transmissions and transaxle service, manual drive train and axles; steering and suspensions, brakes; automotive electricity and heating and A/C theory, as well as engine performance. (900 hours) Instructor: Austin Hicks

**BUILDING CONSTRUCTION TRADES** ~ Prepare students for entry level jobs in the residential construction field. Areas of the trade covered include, but not limited to, tool operation and safety, blueprint reading, foundations, rough framing and layout, interior and exterior finish, interior trim and cabinetry, residential wiring and plumbing and respective code requirements. (900 hours) Instructor: Jeff Swift

**COSMETOLOGY** - Hair styling; shop management; hair shaping; coloring; permanent waves; chemical relaxing; anatomy and chemistry. (A minimum of 1,000 hours required preparation for State License Exam). Nail Technology is included within the Cosmetology curriculum and involves the application and removal of sculpted or artificial nails along with cutting, shaping or enhancing nails. (Nails require a minimum of 250 hours preparation for State License Exam) Instructor: Vicki Garrabrant

**CRIMINAL JUSTICE** ~ Students are provided an overview of the broad Criminal Justice career field and the requisite skills needed to succeed in each of the career fields. Careers studied include, but are not limited to: Local, County and State Police, Dispatcher, Private Investigations, Paralegal, Court Officer, Code Enforcement Officer, Peace Officer, Federal Law Enforcement and Border Patrol. Communication skills (written and oral) and safety practices/procedures are concentrations throughout the course. (900 hours) Instructor: Bill Long

**CULINARY ARTS** - Prepare students for entry-level jobs in the hospitality industry: safety; sanitation; inventory control; recipe conversion; cashiering; waiter/waitress training; introduction to tools and machines of the trade; careers; food preparation for cafeterias, banquets, restaurants; nutrition. (900 hours) Instructor: Stephen Putman

**INNOVATIONS IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY** ~ Students learn about the world of science and technology through a project based learning curriculum. General topics include electronics and engineering principals. Students study the impact of science and technology on the world around them. They work individually and in small groups to develop creative and innovative solutions to real world problems. (900 hours) Instructor: Jonathan Santamoor

**NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT** ~ Students learn about the natural world via the exploration of tree selection and health, wildlife management, vegetable production, crop production and invasive species. Other topics include chain saw safety, sugar bush management, fish and wildlife, animal science and alternative energy. (900 hours) Instructor: Patricia Gilbert

**FOOD ASSISTANT (Hospitality Education)** ~ Training for waiter and waitresses; short order cooks; cafeteria workers; institutional and motel/hotel housekeepers. (900 hours) Instructor: Stephen Putman
